Automated Potato Peeler. Several Mennonite Churches are working together to purchase an automated potato peeler for Friendship Inn. Pre COVID-19 NPMC helped serve meals there and we have had other volunteers contribute to their operation. With volunteers less able to participate in the program an automated peeler will permit them to more effectively assist those utilizing their resources. Mennonite Disaster Service has contributed \$2000.00 of the \$7000.00 cost. The Service group of NPMC has endorsed this opportunity to contribute. There are three giving options:
