## NPMC Reopening Committee Update for Fall 2021

While much of the province has lifted restrictions, there are still many families, businesses, and organizations that have chosen to keep some measures in place to help mitigate risk. The NPMC Reopening Committee and Board of Deacons continues to take a cautious and incremental approach when it comes to easing restrictions. We believe that the guidelines below give people the opportunity for making choices while continuing to keep people safe. These guidelines will take effect on September 1, 2021:

1. Masking will remain in place while inside the church.
2. Pre-registration will no longer be required for worship services, but names will be recorded upon arrival for contact tracing purposes.
3. There will be no capacity limit for worship services.
4. Gatherings involving food will be encouraged to take place outside, but eating will be allowed inside the church as long as people bring their own food. Catering will also be allowed. At this time, only round tables will be set up for groups wanting to eat in the education wing. This will encourage people to sit in small groups that are distanced from one another. This also means that our seating capacity will be approximately 60. Masking will still be required before and after eating.
5. NPMC small groups and external rental groups will have access to our church, and will come up with their own guidelines when it comes to masking, capacity, and food. No groups will have access to the kitchen at this time.

Although this is a plan for the fall, the Reopening Committee plans on meeting regularly to adjust measures as appropriate. We will continue to communicate any changes with the congregation. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me.
