From Earthkeepers: The SES Solar Co-operative is a solar electricity production co-op in which members purchase shares worth approximately the value of an installed solar module. In December of 2014 the Saskatchewan Environmental Society entered a crowd-funded "Business for Good Social Venture Challenge" competition sponsored by Affinity Credit Union to launch the endeavour. Public response to the solar power co-operative was enormous. Since then, the solar co-op has taken shape. A Board of Directors, of which Kelly Winder is a member, has been elected to spearhead the co-operative.
