## Leviticus 25:8-17, 25-28, 35-42

8 You shall count off seven weeks of years, seven times seven years, so that the period of seven weeks of years gives forty-nine years. <sup>9</sup>Then you shall have the trumpet sounded loud; on the tenth day of the seventh month—on the day of atonement—you shall have the trumpet sounded throughout all your land. <sup>10</sup>And you shall hallow the fiftieth year and you shall proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you: you shall return, every one of you, to your property and every one of you to your family. <sup>11</sup>That fiftieth year shall be a jubilee for you: you shall not sow, or reap the aftergrowth, or harvest the unpruned vines. <sup>12</sup>For it is a jubilee; it shall be holy to you: you shall eat only what the field itself produces. <sup>13</sup>In this year of jubilee you shall return, every one of you, to your property. <sup>14</sup>When you make a sale to your neighbour or buy from your neighbour, you shall not cheat one another. <sup>15</sup>When you buy from your neighbour, you shall pay only for the number of years since the jubilee; the seller shall charge you only for the remaining crop-years. <sup>16</sup>If the years are more, you shall increase the price, and if the years are fewer, you shall diminish the price; for it is a certain number of harvests that are being sold to you. <sup>17</sup>You shall not cheat one another, but you shall fear your God; for I am the Lord your God. <sup>25</sup>If anyone of your kin falls into difficulty and sells a piece of property, then the next-of-kin shall come

and redeem what the relative has sold. <sup>26</sup>If the person has no one to redeem it, but then prospers and finds sufficient means to do so, <sup>27</sup>the years since its sale shall be computed and the difference shall be refunded to the person to whom it was sold, and the property shall be returned. <sup>28</sup>But if there are not sufficient means to recover it, what was sold shall remain with the purchaser until the year of jubilee; in the jubilee it shall be released, and the property shall be returned. <sup>35</sup>If any of your kin fall into difficulty and become dependent on you, you shall support them; they shall live with you as though resident aliens. <sup>36</sup>Do not take interest in advance or otherwise make a profit from them, but fear your God; let them live with you. <sup>37</sup>You shall not lend them your money at interest taken in advance, or provide them food at a profit. <sup>38</sup>I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, to give you the land of Canaan, to be your God. <sup>39</sup>If any who are dependent on you become so impoverished that they sell themselves to you, you shall not make them serve as slaves. <sup>40</sup>They shall remain with you as hired or bound labourers. They shall serve with you until the year of the jubilee. <sup>41</sup>Then they and their children with them shall be free from your authority; they shall go back to their own family and return to their ancestral property. <sup>42</sup>For they are my servants, whom I brought out of the land of Egypt; they shall not be sold as slaves are sold.

## Luke 4:16-21

16 When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, <sup>17</sup>and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: <sup>18</sup>‘The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release

to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, <sup>19</sup>to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favour.’ <sup>20</sup>And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. <sup>21</sup>Then he began to say to them, ‘Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.’
