## Spotlight on Peace

Dr. Dale Dewar and her late husband, Bill Curry, are the winners of this year's Joanna Miller Peace Award, an award named after a Saskatoon peace activist and presented jointly by the Saskatoon Peace Coalition, the Cultural Diversity and Race Relations Committee of the City of Saskatoon, Project Plowshares, and several other local peace groups. Beginning in the 1960s, Dewar and Curry participated in the War Resisters League, the international movement to abolish nuclear weapons, supporting Catholic Worker Movement founders Dorothy Day and Daniel Berrigan, working with Physicians for Global Survival, and addressing Canada's unequal relationship with its First Peoples, among other peace work. Patrick represented NPMC at the award ceremony at City Hall this past week.

21 Then Moses called all the elders of Israel and said to them, 'Go, select lambs for your families, and slaughter the passover lamb. <sup>22</sup>Take a bunch of hyssop, dip it in the blood that is in the basin, and touch the lintel and the two doorposts with the blood in the basin. None of you shall go outside the door of your house until morning. <sup>23</sup>For the Lord will pass through to strike down the Egyptians; when he sees the blood on the lintel and on the two doorposts, the Lord will pass over that door and will not allow the destroyer to enter your houses to strike you down. <sup>24</sup>You shall observe this rite as a perpetual ordinance for you and your children. <sup>25</sup>When you come to the land that the Lord will give you, as he has promised, you shall keep this observance. <sup>26</sup>And when your children ask you, "What do you mean by this observance?" <sup>27</sup>you shall say, "It is the passover sacrifice to the Lord, for

he passed over the houses of the Israelites in Egypt, when he struck down the Egyptians but spared our houses." ' And the people bowed down and worshipped. 28 The Israelites went and did just as the Lord had commanded Moses and Aaron. 29 At midnight the Lord struck down all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh who sat on his throne to the firstborn of the prisoner who was in the dungeon, and all the firstborn of the livestock. <sup>30</sup>Pharaoh arose in the night, he and all his officials and all the Egyptians; and there was a loud cry in Egypt, for there was not a house without someone dead. <sup>31</sup>Then he summoned Moses and Aaron in the night, and said, 'Rise up, go away from my people, both you and the Israelites! Go, worship the Lord, as you said. 32Take your flocks and your herds, as you said, and be gone. And bring a blessing on me too!'

#### John 21:1-17

After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. <sup>2</sup>Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin. Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. <sup>3</sup>Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. 4 Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach: but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. 5Jesus said to them, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' They answered him. 'No.' 6He said to them. 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. 7That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the lake. 8But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off. 9 When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it. and bread. <sup>10</sup>Jesus said to them.

Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. 13 Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. 14This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead. 15 When they had finished breakfast. Jesus said to Simon Peter. 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.'
