### **As the weather becomes colder we have some additional information for those attending worship [in person].**

- Plan to keep your coats and boots with you in the sanctuary.
- Visiting will be allowed in the education wing for 15 people, following Health Region guidelines at this time, with masks and striving for appropriate [physical] distancing. An usher will stand at entrance of education wing to [allow 15 people to enter]. Congregants will be asked to exit the sanctuary as ushers direct, and to enter the education wing through the door of the main foyer. When they are done visiting, they will be asked to exit education wing through the main foyer exit doors.
- Congregants who wish to remain to visit in the sanctuary will also be allowed to do so up to a maximum of 15 people. Masks required and appropriate [physical] distancing encouraged.
- Visiting time will be no more than 30 minutes in either location.
