### Job 38:1-7, 34-41

1 Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind: 2<sup>a</sup>Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? 3<sup>b</sup>Gird up your loins like a man, I will question you, and you shall declare to me. 4<sup>c</sup>Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. 5<sup>d</sup>Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? 6<sup>e</sup>On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone 7<sup>f</sup>when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy? 34<sup>g</sup>Can you lift up your voice to the clouds, so that a flood of waters may

cover you? 35<sup>h</sup>Can you send forth lightnings, so that they may go and say to you, 'Here we are'? 36<sup>i</sup>Who has put wisdom in the inward parts, or given understanding to the mind? 37<sup>j</sup>Who has the wisdom to number the clouds? Or who can tilt the waterskins of the heavens, 38<sup>k</sup>when the dust runs into a mass and the clods cling together? 39<sup>l</sup>Can you hunt the prey for the lion, or satisfy the appetite of the young lions, 40<sup>m</sup>when they crouch in their dens, or lie in wait in their covert? 41<sup>n</sup>Who provides for the raven its prey, when its young ones cry to God, and wander about for lack of food?

### Isaiah 53:4-12

4<sup>a</sup>Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. 5<sup>b</sup>But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. 6<sup>c</sup>All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. 7<sup>d</sup>He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. 8<sup>e</sup>By a perversion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people. 9<sup>f</sup>They made his grave with the

wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. 10<sup>g</sup>Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain. When you make his life an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the Lord shall prosper. 11<sup>h</sup>Out of his anguish he shall see light; he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge. The righteous one, my servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. 12<sup>i</sup>Therefore I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.
